

Our commitment to the community is to provide funding through grants in support of long term prosperity and an increase of health and wellness for our future generations. In 2023, we were excited to offer grants to several organizations along the East Shore, in Boswell, Wynndel and Crawford Bay.

#### 2023 GRANT RECIPIENT HIGHLIGHTS:



In partnership with the Town of Creston, the Tilted Brick Gallery Association/Art Space is committed to beautifying the Creston community to promote tourism, elevate Creston's cultural presence in the community and to heighten the sense of pride for our community. The Hillside project is one of 3 projects with the Town of Creston with the Art Space Members. Flowers were painted and photo-transferred, then printed onto a weatherproof aluminum by local business, Rook Design Media to be able to withstand the weather on the retaining wall on Hillside St. The pictures were curated and installed by the Art Space Members.



**BADEV** has been operating on the East Shore from Kuskanook to Burden's Cut, a span of highway approximately 35 km long, since 1980. Without the right equipment and dedicated volunteers this organization would not be able to provide the necessary services to save lives in our community.

#### **Boswell and District Emergency Volunteers (BADEV)**

is a group of East Shore residents who provide emergency care and support to anyone experiencing a medical incident such as a heart attack, drowning or a motor vehicle incident. There are times when it can take over an hour for an ambulance or Fire and Rescue to arrive either from Riondel or Creston. BADEV volunteers, who are trained in first aid, CPR and traffic control, can help bridge the gap and manage those emergency situations. Each member of BADEV is equipped with a full array of first aid supplies, including oxygen and defibrillators. Larger equipment such as backboards, basket stretchers and a snow sled for patient transfers are stored at the Boswell Memorial Hall. In 2023, the CVCF was proud to grant \$2,500 for the replacement of 4 automated external defibrillators (AEDs) that had reached their expiry dates.



The Wynndel Community Centre offers the community a facility for recreation, education, and a variety of sports activities for both seniors and youth, as well as meeting areas and family gatherings. Operated entirely be volunteers, the center has secured funding from the Columbia Basin Trust Seniors and Elders grants to enhance comfort for elderly users through energy and building upgrades. This funding was initially intended to cover the existing ramp access to the upper hall, with the assumption that the existing metal railing could be reused. Unfortunatly, the railings could not be retrofitted, necessitating the installation of new ones. Additional funds from the CVCF have been granted to complete the ramp, ensuring safe access for individuals with mobility issues, strollers, and equipment.



The Starbelly Jam Festival takes place every July in Crawford Bay, aiming to create family-friendly environment that celebrates diverse cultures and lifestyle while serving as an economic boost for the community. To encourage family participation, the children 12 and under can attend for free, with daytime activities including craft classes and children's music, while the evenings cater more to older teens and adults. The festival is committed to Truth and Reconciliation, featuring multiple Indigenous artists. Additionally, it provides a platform for local artists and business owners to showcase their talents to the many tourists who visit Crawford Bay for the event. The CVCF has granted support to help cover the festival's operating costs, ensuring accessibility for everyone in the community, including senoirs and individuals with mobility challenges.
